

I-6 LIVE WORK – VOCATIONAL PROGRAMS

The Board believes that live work is beneficial and enriches the program for some vocational students.

Definition

Live work consists of tasks or jobs performed under actual work conditions. Such work is performed without monetary compensation to individual students as a part of their approved training program. Live work may be performed on school premises or on appropriate job location in the community and may consist of service, repair or production jobs, which relate specifically to the student's vocational curriculum.

Relationship to Training

Live work will be conducted when, in the opinion of the instructor and vocational administrator, the training program requires such projects for acquisition of occupational skills and knowledge. Live work will be assigned to an individual student by his/her instructor(s) as part of the student's training program.

Service Charges for Live Work Projects

The total charges (cost plus a service charge) for live work will be as follows:

- Actual cost plus 20%
- A minimum charge not to exceed ten (10) dollars, provided cost plus percentage does not exceed minimum charge.
- All monies collected for live work will be receipted to the customer and subsequently deposited by the bookkeeper at the appropriate school.

Restrictions on Live Work

To avoid competition with private enterprise, live work shall be restricted as follows:

- Live work will be done only when it is essential for the acquisition of relevant occupation skills.
- No person, regardless of his/her connections, shall use the work performed by vocational students for personal gain or profit.
- All live work will be performed by students, and no written or implied warranties shall apply.
- Live work will be conducted consistent with Board adopted policies and procedures governing student participation in school activities.
